# Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of half yearly and year to date standalone financial results of MESON VALVES INDIA LIMITED (FORMALLY KNOWN AS "MESON VALVES INDIA PRIVATE LIMITED (the "Company") for the half year and year ended on March 31, 2024 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").
